

Construction Status

PROJECT	DESCRIPTION	CONSTRUCTION UPDATES	
Forest Hill Flyover (P3)	Creates a bridge over the current Belt Railway Company/ Metra/Norfolk Southern railroad tracks between Damen Avenue and Western Avenue along 75 th Street to eliminate delays due to train crossings.	Temporary track construction for shoofly Stage 1 was completed and in operation in June 2023. Permanent construction for P3 started in 2022 and is expected to continue through 2026. Ongoing work includes construction of bridge piers, steel girders, retaining walls, abutments, and other structural elements. New track and signal work is underway.	
71 st Street Grade Separation (GS19)	Creates a bridge over the road and sidewalks at 71st Street between Hamilton and Bell Avenues to eliminate the conflict between the railroads and roadway users.	Final roadway reconstruction will follow the completion of the Forest Hill Flyover (P3) project anticipated in 2025	
Community Mobility Improvements	Repair and replacement of sidewalks, curbs, and ramps; resurfacing of local streets; improvements to bus stops; and planting of new and replacement trees along streets in the project area (roughly between Damen and Western Avenues and 67th to 84th Streets).	Construction completed during 2021, 2022, and 2023 for all 154 P3/GS19 Community Mobility Improvement locations. Projects EW2 and P2 are being evaluated for additional CMIs.	
Metra Bridge Raise Project (EW2)	Modifies an existing railroad bridge near 79 th Street and Ashland Avenue to ensure Metra's new Auburn Park station integrates smoothly with CREATE Program improvements in the area.	The final design is expected to be completed in 2025. The construction bid will be issued after the final design is completed.

- 1. Apply for training through the Highway Construction Careers Training Program (HCCTP) at Dawson Technical Institute of Kennedy-King College.*
- **2. Get trained in highway construction-related skills** in a 16-week intensive training, eight hours a day, five days a week.
- 3. Position yourself to get hired! After completing the program, you will be in an approved pool of candidates for construction jobs (employment is not guaranteed).

*Must be 18+, have a high school diploma or GED, a valid driver's license and successfully complete drug screenings
